'Breaking Barriers'



Euroweek



The Departments of Geography and History at JC participated in this year's Euroweek project in Kain, Tournai, Belgium from 3 to 10 October. First established in 1992, Euroweek has become an annual event with the grand scope of bringing together hundreds of European youths. The primary aim is 'bringing together European school pupils to share their experiences, and thus promote awareness of and respect for each other's cultures'. This year's edition, bringing together 250 students and teachers from 25 EU countries, focused on the need to promote sustainable development.
