Visits to UM

On Wednesday, 20 March, the Physics Department organised two visits for first and second year students taking Physics at Advanced and Intermediate Levels: one to the Faculty for the Built Environment and the other to the Faculty of ICT.

The group of students who went to the Faculty for the Built Environment was greeted by the Dean of the Faculty, Professor Alex Torpiano, who gave a presentation about the courses offered and the opportunities they lead to. Afterwards students had time to ask questions, and were also given a tour of the laboratories.



The other group visiting the Department of Microelectronics and Nanoelectronics was given a presentation by the Head of the Department, Professor Ing Edward Gatt. Later the students were shown different projects done by university students and were later taken to the workshop. They were also given information about Artificial Intelligence.

These two visits have put Physics students in a better position to make a well informed choice about UM courses, leading them to the profession that mostly suits them.



Biodiversity on a small scale.... Lichen Salad for the snails:

These snails Papillifera papillaris (about 1 cm in length) were observed on a low wall within the College Campus grounds feeding happily on lichens. These snails are very common in Malta but capturing them feeding is a less common sight. Lichens are fantastic organisms as they actually consist of two cohabiting species which help each other out: what we see (often as a crustlike growth on rocks) is the fungus but within this fungus is an alga which supplies nutrients through photosynthesis to the fungus. Special thanks to Professor Patrick J. Schembri for the identification of the snail species.


